NCBA Board Minutes Friday, August 27, 2004 NC Baptist Medical Center – Winston Salem, NC

I. Call to Order

Chad Granade called the meeting to order at 10:25 am. The meeting was hosted by Sam Wright, and held at WFUBMC in Winston Salem, NC.

Members present: Chad Granade, Helen Jones, Glenn Scales, David Wilson, Sam Wright, Kris Peters, and Christina Flemming

II. Approval of July Minutes

The July minutes were approved with no discussion. Motion to approve was made by Sam Wright and a second came from Chad Granade.

III. Review of 2004 Goals and Objectives

Chad reviewed the 2004 goals and objectives as set at the February retreat. The goals has progressed as follows:

Mentoring: Mentoring by the current board members needs to be stepped up at this time. Candidate recruitment should be in its final stages.

<u>Tracks</u>: All tracks have been established and are implemented into the symposium education schedule already.

Stand Alone classes: One class has been completed, and was a great success. Another, Intelleview, is scheduled for September at Baptist Hospital in Winston Salem, NC. Education Report

Chad Granade distributed a list of classes for the symposium. The schedule is full. The class schedule as well as room assignments was reviewed. Minimal changes were made and the schedule should be updated on the web site soon



Four ARAMARK Employees Named To New Technology Management Council

"Through the Council we have the opportunity to continue to provide resources to biomed technicians and those in the field who will become the future of clinical engineering."

Technology managers—who include biomedical equipment technicians, clinical engineers, and other health care professionals—play a vital role in health care in helping to purchase, assess, properly operate, and maintain medical devices and technology.

The Council is an outgrowth of efforts started in 2003 by a special AAMI Task Force, which examined issues facing the technology management field. The Council is expected to help advance the field, much like the Task Force, whose members helped publish AAMI's special information technology publication, *IT Horizons*; and helped develop AAMI's Employment Survey published in the Nov/Dec 2003 issue of AAMI's journal, *Biomedical Instrumentation & Technology*.



Proposed Expansion of Board of Directors

November 5, 1980 is a historic date in the life of the NCBA. It was on that date that the first elections were held for NCBA officers. Of the 43-member population, 10 distinguished gentlemen were chosen to become the first board of directors. Since that time the membership of the NCBA has multiplied. In 2004 we are approaching twelve times the number of members that we began with. However, since that first election, the number of individuals elected to the board of directors has remained at ten.

In an effort to more appropriately represent the general membership population of the NCBA as well as to increase the number of participants planning and organizing the annual symposium, the current board of directors are making a motion to increase the number of board representatives to twelve. Currently, five members are elected to the board each year, and each serves a two-year term. Five board members rotate off each year, so there are five newly elected officers each year. Adding to the board will mean that six individuals will be elected each year. If this proposal is approved by the general membership, the 2005 election will be held in search of seven individuals. The top six vote getters will serve a two-year term. The seventh highest vote getter will serve a one-year term and then either rotate off, or be eligible for re-election. Each following year there will be six members elected to the board.

This addition will require a change in the by-laws of the NCBA, which will require a vote by the membership. This article is to server as notification to the membership of the NCBA that there will be a vote on this proposal at the beginning of the business meeting in December. If you should have any further questions concerning this proposal please feel free to contact any of the current board of directors.



V. Old Business



With no further business to be discussed, motion to adjourn came from Sam Wright. Chad Granade gave a second, and the meeting adjourned at 1:40 PM.



NCBA Introduces On-Line Symposium Registration

After years of having members and our vendors register for the Symposium by mailing in paper forms, we have decided to try something different this year. In June the NCBA web site was updated to include all the vendor registration information. At that time we rolled out an on-line registration process on the NCBA web site.

So far about six vendors have registered via this new method. One advantage for our vendors is that they receive written confirmation – usually the same day they submit their registration. This ensures that they will have a booth reserved for them at the Symposium. Last year the Exposition Hall was sold out and we were unable to accommodate three vendors who wanted to register during the last week before the show.

Starting September 1st, individual members can now register on line. The main Symposium web page and the daily class listing pages have a link set up to take you to the on-line registration form. Although we are unable to accept credit card payment (or purchase orders) the on-line registration is very quick and easy. This will allow you to get registered the same day you submit the form. Otherwise it can take over a week when you factor in mail delivery time and the fact that the NCBA mail box sometimes can only be checked once a week. Some classes this year are expected to fill up early and whoever registers first gets a confirmed space. It is rare for us to have to limit class sizes, but the rooms at Pinehurst do have seating capacities that we cannot exceed.

Due to the costs associated with processing credit card payments, we are unable to accept on-line payments this year. If the response to this new system is sufficient, we may be able to accept credit card payments next year. In order to take credit card payments we may have to add a handling fee. This would amount to about \$7.00 for individuals and \$3.00 for students. If you would take advantage of this next year, please e-mail your comments to Glenn Scales at address web@ncbiomedassoc.com. Your feedback is essential in helping the Board decide if this is something that the members would like. Please let us hear from you by e-mail or at the Symposium.

Vendors, the same issue applies to you. Our best estimate for a projected credit card processing fee is 3% or \$15.00 for each \$500 booth registration. These fees are set by the credit card processing companies. We talked about providing credit card processing this year and just raising the registration fee. However, it didn't seem fair to those who would choose to pay by check. We really want your feedback on this so we know how to proceed next year.


